

Dear Residents,

I am extremely grateful for the opportunity to introduce you to two more fantastic Live Oak employees, Fire Chief Linc Surber and Fire Captain Chris Everett, from our fire department. These two men are a fine example of the many dedicated employees we have in our community serving the residents.

Chief Surber has been an exceptional leader from day one and continues to bring new ideas and updated technology to Live Oak Fire Services. Born and raised in San Antonio, he attended MacArthur High School with vocational training in electronics repair. After graduating, he attended San Antonio College studying mechanical engineering, but switched to Firefighter Certification School and Emergency Medical Technician certification. Chief Surber graduated with a Paramedic certification from UT Health Science Center in 1982 and would soon be hired to work for the City of Alamo Heights. As one of the youngest members of the fire department, he was promoted to the position of EMS Coordinator with the responsibility of creating an EMS service for the cities of Alamo Heights, Olmos Park, and Terrell Hills in 1983.

Chief Surber earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from Wayland Baptist University and an associate's degree in Fire Science from San Antonio College in 1995. He spent 20 years at Alamo Heights with the highest rank of assistant fire chief. Chief Surber would then go on to serve as fire chief in Shavano Park for 9 years and Olmos Park for 7 years, before coming to Live Oak in 2018. Chief Surber is married to Susan Locke, a dentist in Alamo Heights. They have two grown children and one new baby granddaughter. In his spare time, he enjoys hunting and fishing and Hill Country landscaping. Chief Surber has always felt welcomed by the Live Oak community and feels very lucky to be a member of "Team Live Oak."

Chris Everett began his fire service career as a junior firefighter in 1996 with the Ottine Volunteer Fire Department where his father was and remains the current fire chief. After attending his first official fire training at TEEX Municipal Fire Training School in College Station, Chris knew it was his calling. After serving in the Texas Army National Guard from 1999 to 2007 and completing his basic and advanced training, he returned home and began attending the Fire Academy. Chris has been fighting fires ever since his graduation. Throughout his career, Chris has worn many hats and climbed the ranks quickly in every department he served under. He has received the honor of Firefighter of the Year twice during his career with Gonzales Fire Department and Employee of the Quarter and the Safety Award with Live Oak Fire Department.

While working in Live Oak, Chris was promoted to lieutenant in 2016 and captain in 2019. He serves as Live Oak's Fire Training Officer, overseeing, planning, and executing training for all new firefighters. Chris proudly leads the crew of A-shift. For the last 11 years with the city of Live Oak, he has made it his goal to serve our citizens and build Live Oak's Fire Department into the premier fire department of the Northeast region.



Chris resides in New Braunfels, Texas with his beautiful wife of 10 years, Jessica, two daughters, Savannah and Payton; and three fur babies. The Everetts hope to build a house somewhere on a small ranch in the near future.

# City Awarded The 2020 Texas Municipal League's Excellence Award For Its "Safety Spot"

The City of Live Oak had noticed a rise in the number of worker's compensation claims and injuries due to work-related accidents. The Safety Committee rolled out a program called the "Safety Spot" for safety awareness. The program detailed that any time there were three or more employees meeting together, one would volunteer a safety tip to help those in the meeting prevent work related accidents. The topics covered began as somewhat of a joke with anecdotes that happened in their personal lives, but rapidly caught on. The topics became more work-related, to include backing up of city vehicles, lifting heavy objects, and preventing storage and clutter that lead to tripping hazards.

The program became even more important as the novel Covid-19 pandemic began to expand. "Safety spots" quickly turned from wearing appropriate safety gear for public works to appropriate methods of taking off rubber gloves and the use of sanitation materials effectively. Much attention was even given to the way employees wash their hands during the work day.

The year prior to August 2019, the City had logged 21 safety-related accidents and 14 worker's compensation claims, making the monthly average of 1.75 safety reports. Since the inception of the program, the number of incidents have been reduced to a 1.16 monthly average, a 33.7% reduction. The program has impacted everyone. It has made everyone aware that safety is important to the



city, and all employees should join in the commitment to ensure everyone goes home safely and injury-free at the end of the day. Employees now see it as a badge of honor to be selected to provide the safety topic when called.

Texas Municipal League (TML) recognized the importance of the program and awarded the City of Live Oak the 2020 Municipal Excellence Award for "Management Innovations under 25,000 Population" during the annual TML Conference in October 2020. Mayor Mary M. Dennis, council, administrators, and staff proudly accepted the honor during the virtual event. The Safety Spot Program has proven to be a program of well-being and helped our employees to go home at night injury free.



## **Employee Of The Quarter**

The Employee of the Quarter Award recognizes the accomplishments of individuals employed by the City of Live Oak. Four individuals receive the award each year. Each quarter, an employee is nominated by a coworker or supervisors and selected by administration as the Employee of the Quarter. The employee selected must have outstanding service, leadership, work relationships, achievement of objectives over and beyond assigned duties, and excellent work performance. The winners of the award are presented with a plaque by the Mayor and City Council members during a regular meeting of the Council.

The award for the last quarter October through December 2020 goes to Kyle Weese, Parks Supervisor from Public Works. Kyle was nominated by his peers for the important work he performed supervising city park operations during the pandemic. The pandemic shed light on how important parks and open spaces are for everyone. Kyle has ensured the parks are a safe place to go where community members can enjoy activities such as fishing, disc golf and use of the trail system. He continues to oversee a thorough cleaning regimen of restrooms and playground equipment in order to

keep visitors safe. Kyle remains focused on providing top notch service not only to Live Oak residents, but many others who rely on the physical and mental benefits who the park system provides. Kyle is a positive, encouraging supervisor who builds the morale of the employees around him. He is truly an asset to the city. Congratulations Kyle!

We look forward to recognizing each employee who exemplifies excellence through his or her daily commitment to our City. It is the hard work and dedication of these staff members that makes our success possible.

Her kind heart and love for animals is what motivates her to push forward and make each year's drive bigger and better than before. # Gone, but not forgotten Anthony and Phillip

City officials and employees and Live Oak residents continue to mourn the loss of Councilman Anthony Brooks and his spouse Phillip Tsai-Brooks one year after the couple succumbed to the COVID-19 virus. Anthony and Phillip were the best of us. As the anniversary of their deaths approaches, we realize all the ways we have missed them. In this edition of the Hometown News magazine, we want to tell you a little about their lives together and the work and years of service they gave to the city of Live Oak. The couple bought a home in Live Oak which they shared with Phillip's mother Pacita Tsai. Both men soon became an integral part of the community by becoming very active in Live Oak's city government.

Anthony Brooks, 52, was first elected to the City Council in 2015 and was a valued and active member until 2020. During his tenure as a councilman, he served as mayor pro tem several of those years. His favorite topic was always the city's annual budget. Although his job assignments would have him away from the city at times, he always stayed connected to his service and committed to our residents. He also served as a Council Director of the Live Oak Economic Development Corporation (EDC). He served honorably in the United States Air Force and continued to serve as a national reservist. An Air Force veteran, Anthony worked as a resource analyst (Chief, Acquisition Management) at the Army Medical Command, Joint Base San Antonio-Fort Sam Houston. Before Anthony's passing, he moved his parents James and Littie to the San Antonio area to take care of them due to health issues. Sadly, on January 21, 2020, Littie passed away and on March 12, 2020, James passed away.

Phillip Tsai-Brooks, 42, was the owner of Extreme Opulence Hair Studio just outside Shavano Park. He opened the popular salon on December 30, 2017, joined by friends, family, and Anthony. Even though Tsai-Brooks owned a small business, he found time in his busy schedule to be involved with the City's government. He served as a member of the Board of Adjustment from 2008 until 2015. He then continued serving the City when the Mayor and City Council appointed him as a Citizen Director on the EDC Board until his death in April 2020. His main concern as EDC Director was always on helping small businesses. As a small business owner, he understood the struggles that come with the



job. Everyone who knew Phillip says he was kind, had a contagious laugh, and a heart of gold. He is dearly missed by his clients, staff; friends, family, and neighbors. Phillip is survived by his mother and the four Tsai brothers: Alfred, Robert, Edwin, and Anthony Tsai.

The couple loved to travel together when their schedules allowed it. We looked forward to hearing the stories of their travels when they returned home. They were fortunate to visit many countries and famous cities together during their time on Earth. Friends and family members said they made great memories and lifelong friendships on almost every trip.

On what would have been Anthony's 53rd birthday, Mayor Mary M. Dennis, and City Council declared August 25, 2020, "Anthony Brooks Day." The occasion was commemorated by placing a bronze plaque on the wall in the Council Chamber lobby in Anthony's honor. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the private ceremony was attended only by Mayor Mary Dennis, Councilman Aaron Dahl, City Administrators Scott Wayman, and Michael Hornes, and department heads.

We are forever grateful for Anthony's and Phillip's service to the Live Oak Community and our country and it brings us comfort to know they left this world together. Both men were a huge part of what makes "Live Oak Strong," and their impact on our community is already missed. May God bless the Brooks-Tsai family and all who were lucky to call them "friends."







As we approach spring, let's remember to be safe and keep an eye on the weather. March is a busy month for weather, and floods and tornados can be a recipe for disaster. If you are under a flood warning, find safe shelter right away, TURN AROUND, DON'T DROWN. People underestimate the force and power of water. A mere 6 inches of fast-moving flood water can knock over an adult, and 24 inches can carry a small car. It is never safe to drive or walk into flood waters. Tornados can happen anytime and anywhere. If you do find yourself in a tornado warning go to a safe interior room, and stay away from windows, doors, and outside walls.



In 1961, Congress established National Poison Prevention Week to raise awareness, reduce unintentional poisonings, and promote poison prevention. This year, March 14th-20th is National Poison Prevention Week. More than two million poisonings are reported to poison control center each year across the country, according to Health Resources & Services Administration. The Texas Poison Center Network has seen a 70% increase in calls related to cleaning products and disinfectants. We remind the citizens of Live Oak of the importance of proper use and handling of cleaning products and disinfectants during this pandemic. FOR IMMEDIATE HELP WITH A POISONING, CALL 1-800-222-1222 AS WELL AS 911.

The Live Oak Fire Department has teamed up the Texas Health & Human Service Texas Targeted Opioid Response, to provide the Single Use Disposal Systems (SUDS). SUDS are a convenient and environmentally friendly way to dispose of your unused or expired prescription medications. You simply pick up a pre-paid "TakeAway" (TAE) envelope from the Live Oak Fire Department, take it home and place your medication(s) in the envelope, then mail it off where it will be incinerated unopened. This methods is safer than flushing or throwing them in the trash.



# Protect Your Property

## from the hazards of flooding and wind

Do you have occasional flooding in your house? If so, various methods may be used to minimize flooding. If the floor level of your property is lower than the "Base Flood Elevation" (elevation of the 100-year flood, based on the FEMA maps), consider elevating your structure. If a flood is imminent, your property can be protected by sandbagging areas where water enters into living spaces. The City of Live Oak's Public Works Department may be available to assist with sandbagging efforts. Valuables

and furniture may also be moved to higher areas of the dwelling to minimize damages. Attaching plywood or specially made panels over windows and patio doors may help protect against high wind damages associated with tornados. The City will make site visits to provide one-on-one advice to a property owner regarding flooding and drainage issues on private property upon request.

## **Stay Ready**

Nonperishable food, water, batteries, flashlights, a manual can opener, and a battery-operated radio should be kept available during inclement weather. If your property is in imminent danger of flooding, contact City Public Service at (210)353-4357 to request that your power and natural gas be shut off. This number may also provide assistance regarding any other electrical or natural gas emergencies.

If dangerous flooding conditions are imminent, avoid driving a vehicle if possible. Do not attempt to drive or wade through

low areas or deep pockets of water or running washes. Always have an evacuation plan for your family. Stay tuned to local radio or television stations (WOAI 1200 AM), (KKYX 680 AM), (KSATTV (ABC) 12), (WOAI (NBC) 4), (KABB-TV (FOX) 29) and (KENSTV (CBS) 5) for the latest local weather conditions and news. # Did you know?

Our senior citizens are just one of the targeted groups for scams, identity theft, and fraud. Unfortunately, we all know someone who has been affected by scammers. Seniors are targeted because they're more likely to have a nest egg in the bank and are sometimes less familiar with today's technology. Scammers contact victims by telephone, in person, through email, Facebook, and other social media sites. The first rule of thumb: if it sounds too good to be true, it most likely is FRAUD. NEVER give out your personal information.



There are many scams out in the world today, but let's talk about the top five that scammers use to target our seniors. Unfortunately, Medicare fraud is the most common. It's hard to think people would prey on those needing medical assistance the most, but they do. They pose as Medicare representatives and trick seniors into providing their personal information over the phone. Legitimate representatives will NEVER ask for personal information; they already have it in their system.





Tax fraud and identity theft are two more ways scammers use stolen personal information, including social security numbers and ID numbers to apply for credit cards and even claim tax returns for themselves. The most common way scammers get your information is by tricking you into giving information during an unsolicited phone call.

Lastly, two additional types of scams are unsolicited emails and fake virus scanners. In today's world, no one is safe from predatory scammers. Scammers use emails to con you out of your money. They ask the person to send a gift card to a fake relief fund or a fake charity organization. The newest form of email scam claims to be from the U.S. Treasury Department offering grants and stimulus payments in exchange for personal financial information or an advance fee. PLEASE DO NOT RESPOND!



Fake virus scanners come in the form of a pop-up window on a computer while in use. These pop-up windows can be fake alerts to trick victims into downloading a "virus scanner." However, these so-called "scanners" are actually real computer viruses that give criminals access to private information stored on a computer.

Anyone can be a target of fraud or a scam, no matter their age. But with a little research and smart decision-making, seniors can keep themselves from being a victim. If you think you or a family member is being scammed, contact the Live Oak Police Department for assistance.



Items cannot be placed at the curb before Tuesday, March 23rd.

Waste Management will only pass by once. Please remember not to cover the sidewalk or water meter with your items, and do not park along the curb near the bulky items.

#### Lawn Clipping and Yard Debris

- Believe it or not, grass clippings, fallen leaves, and other materials that can wash off the lawns are stormwater pollutants.
- Yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute unwanted nutrients and organic matter to streams.
- Do not blow or place yard debris in the street, sidewalk, storm drain, wetland or water body.
- Utilize yard waste. Lawn clippings and fallen leaves decompose into natural fertilizers that enrich soil. The
  decomposition process can be expedited through mulching or composting.

#### **CODE CORNER**

The New Year is in full swing, and now may be a great time for a little Spring Cleaning!

As the spring season creeps in, so does the urge to clean out the house! We understand cleaning out your house may mean you will be getting rid of items that take up space in your house but also may be too large or hazardous for Waste Management to pick-up. The following items will not be allowed during regular trash pickup by Waste Management: furniture, mattresses/box springs, fence boards/poles, appliances, building materials, electronics, flammable materials, fluorescent light bulbs, chemical products, liquids, medical waste/needles, and tires. Code Compliance officers would also remind our residents those same items cannot be stored in public view on the property.

The City does have special bulk pick-ups twice a year usually in March and October. The next scheduled bulk pick-up date scheduled will be on Monday, March 29th. You may place your unwanted bulk items to the curb by Sunday, March 28th. Items CANNOT be placed out for bulk pick-up more than three days prior to the bulk pick-up date. Any items placed out prior than 72 hours to the bulk pick-up date will be in violation of our ordinances and be considered an outside storage/sanitation violation. If you happen to spring clean earlier than the bulk pick-up date, please store the items in the house/garage or out of public view until the bulk pick-up date.
