It has been a pleasure to be a part of a city that is continuing to grow as a major economic sector in the region and being able to watch our residential community grow and flourish.

Not only do I hope you enjoyed your summer break thus far but I hope everyone has had a chance to enjoy our beautiful parks, playgrounds, improved walking trails and disc golf courses. The Parks and Recreation crews work very hard in maintaining the grounds so we all are able to enjoy such beautiful natural surroundings. Also, you probably have noticed that the work has been completed on the Toepperwein Road widening project which has been well received by the community. The Lookout Road reconstruction began in June and the Bridlewood Subdivision street project is estimated to be substantially completed soon. Big heartfelt thanks go out to the city staffs of Universal City, Selma and Live Oak for hosting a very successful E-Cycle event. With a collaborative effort, we were able to collect and properly destroy 25 tons of electronic items dropped off by the surrounding residents. Each city provided staff to assist in unloading the items from the resident's vehicles and reloading it onto a total of four trucks for destruction. In recent years the increase of regulations and a better understanding of the environment dictate that many materials in e-waste can't be tossed in a landfill. E-waste contains a number of toxic elements that must be disposed of safely and kept out of our landfills. By participating and supporting your community's environmental missions we can change the world. We look forward to seeing you at next year's E-Cycle Event...everyone wins...including the environment!

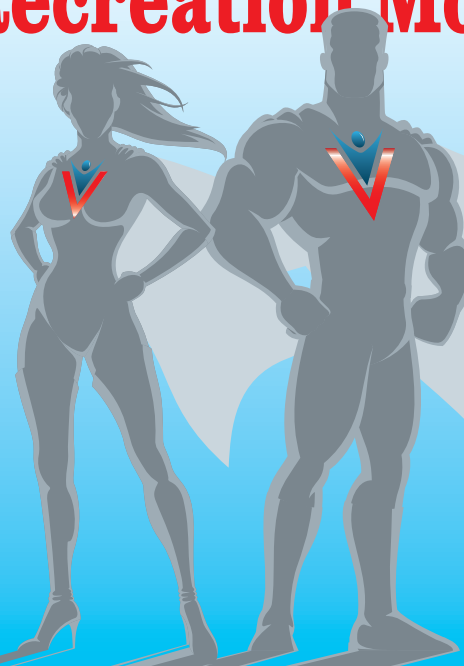

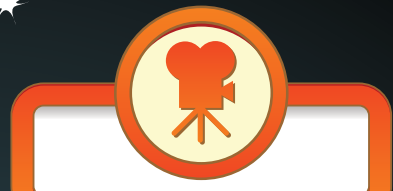

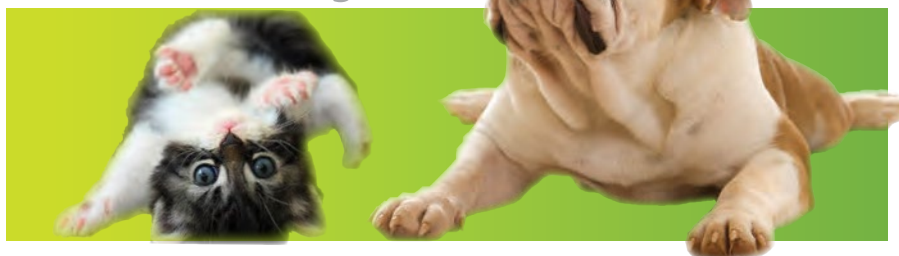

Renovation Done Right!



DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

Did you know

that today over one million children in the U.S. have been poisoned by lead from old paint? Home repairs that create even a small amount of lead dust are enough to poison your child and put your family at risk. If you live in a home or apartment that was built prior to 1978, make sure you renovate right with a contractor that is Lead-Safe Certified.

The RRP Rule (Renovations, Repair and Painting Rule): Certified Renovator Responsibilities:

- Perform work and direct lead-safe work practices.
- Penalties, Steep fines are levied for violators \$37,500
- Maximum removal inside 6 sq. ft., and 20 sq. ft. outside
- HUD project's maximum removal 2 sq. ft.

Information for Property Owners of Rental Housing, Child-Occupied Facilities:

Property owners who renovate, repair, or prepare surfaces for painting in pre-1978 rental housing or spaces rented by child-care facilities must, before beginning work, provide tenants with a copy of EPA's lead hazard information pamphlet.

RENOVATE RIGHT: *Important Lead Hazard Information for Families, Child Care Providers, and Schools.*

Owners of these rental properties must document compliance with this requirement; EPA has a sample of pre-renovation

IMPORTANT NOTE: As per the EPA, A homeowner is defined as someone living on the property; if they are performing the work, the homeowner will be exempt from the rule. However, you have the ultimate responsibility for the safety of your family or children in your care. A property owner is defined as someone that owns the property but does not reside at the location; they will have to comply with the rule.

Fines may be levied if compliance is not met.

disclosure form that may be used for this purpose.

Property owners who perform these projects in pre-1978 rental housing or spaces rented by child-care facilities must be certified and must follow the lead-safe work practices required by EPA's Renovation, Repair and Remodeling rule. To become certified, property owners must submit an application to EPA. The Agency has up to 90 days after receiving a complete request for certification to approve or disapprove the application.

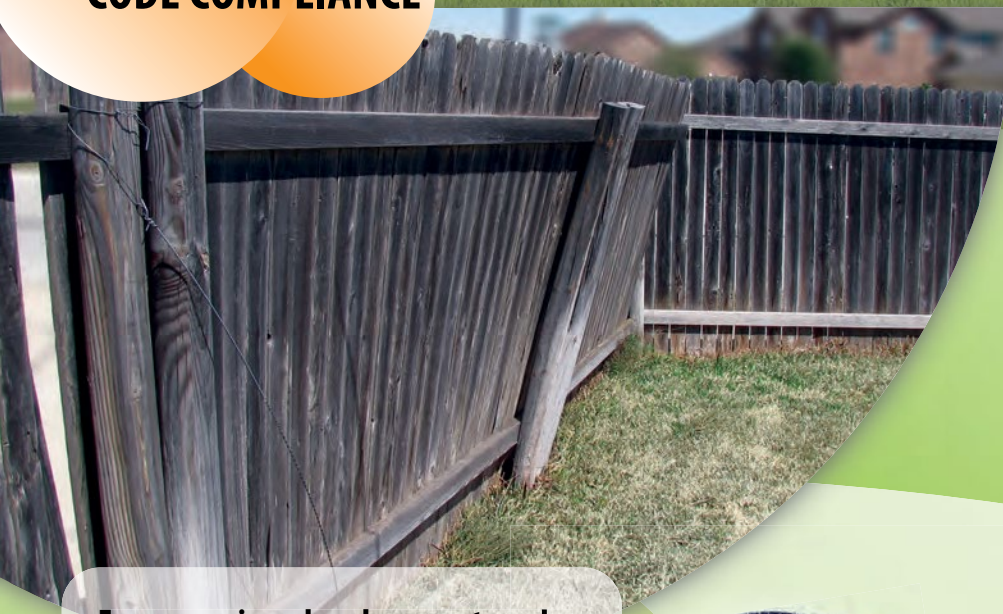

Fence repair and replacement can be expensive when it is done all at one time. We recommend repairing those few broken boards as they break rather than waiting until there is total structural failure. Remember when installing a new fence; be sure to contact a professional who can provide you quality workmanship! Summer is just around the corner, so fence repair and maintenance will no doubt be a common scene around the City of Live Oak. Fences serve many purposes such as privacy, protection, and overall aesthetics of your property. The city adopted the 2015 International Property Maintenance Code which sets forth certain guidelines to help our city remain beautiful and attractive to potential homebuyers. The IPMC, which our office uses as a tool for guidance, states that “All accessory structures, including detached garages, fences and walls, shall be maintained structurally sound and in good repair.”

Our neighborhood showcases several different styles of fences that serve their purpose for privacy. The general idea is that all fences must be maintained and in a good state of repair. Damaged, rotted or warping fences cause so many problems as well as robbing the city of its welcoming character. Code Compliance does more than just remind you about the grass and weeds. We identify properties with fences that need some sort of repair, either broken fence pieces or sections of fences that are leaning. Children walking by the fences can easily be harmed should the fence fall on them or fall on someone’s property.

Hurricane Season

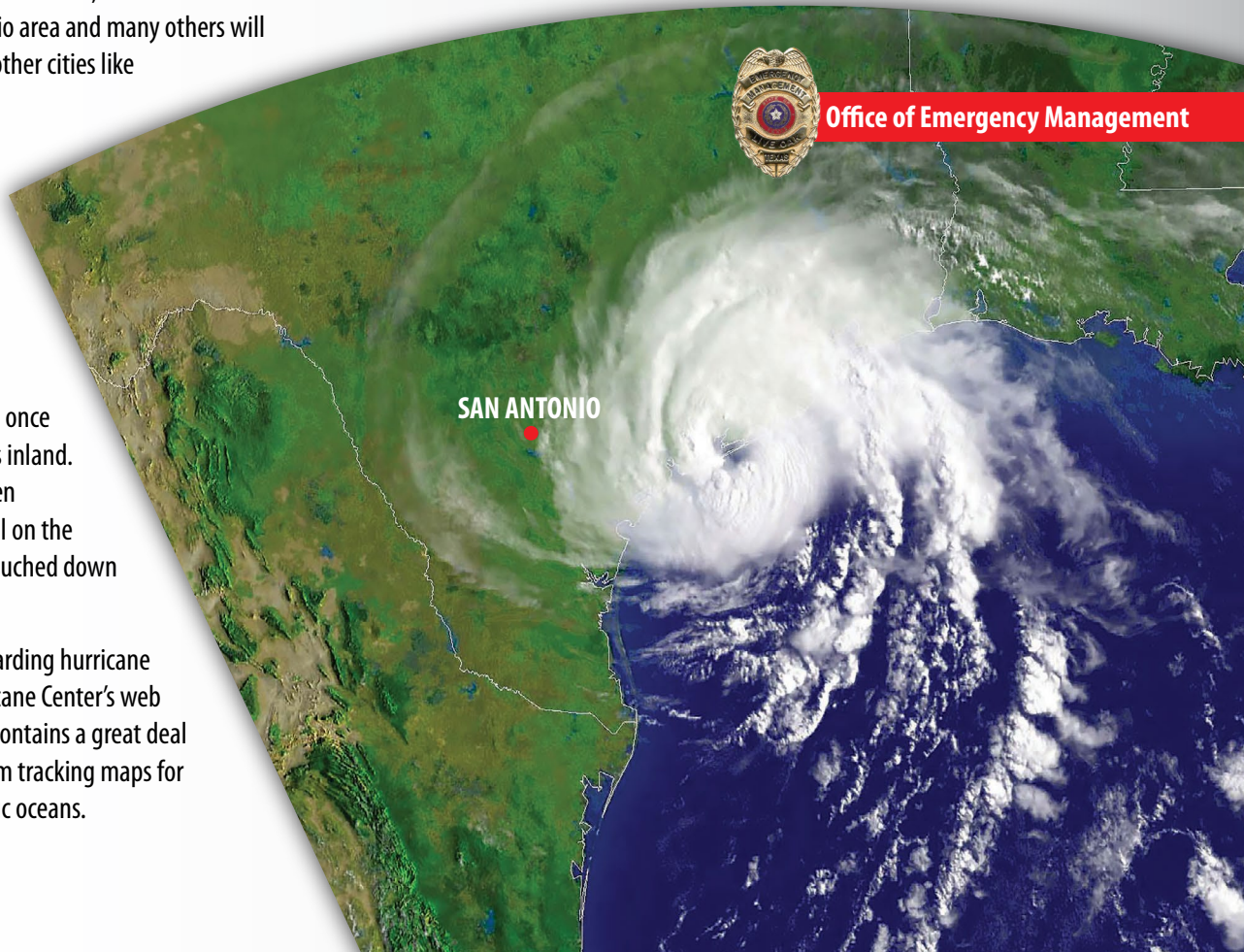
The 2016 Atlantic Hurricane Season began on June 1st, 2016 and continues until the end of November. Early predictions suggested that this might be an active year in part due to our changing weather patterns. The El Nino condition in the Pacific has been fading slowly and the experts predict it may be gone by mid Summer. If so this could open the door for a very active hurricane season since the prime time for storms in the Atlantic is around mid August until mid October. As of now, the predictions for the 2016 season are for 14 named storms; 8 hurricanes, and 4 major hurricanes, category 3 or above. As a reminder we already had one storm this year! Alex occurred in January of 2016 making landfall in the Azores.

Needless to say, we haven't had a major storm in the Gulf threatening the Texas coast for several years and subsequently many new folks have moved into the region who have never been through a storm. As such the State is actively promoting training and exercises for the coastal regions that included a full scale evacuation exercise for the lower Rio Grande Valley at the beginning of June.

As a reminder if a tropical storm should threaten the Texas Coast, the City of San Antonio and Bexar County play a vital role in any hurricane evacuations ordered by the coastal jurisdictions. The Alamo Regional Command Center (ARCC) is located here and this facility coordinates many of the activities that occur during a coastal evacuation. In addition, thousands of coastal residents will evacuate to the San Antonio area and many others will pass through Bexar County to other cities like Austin.

In addition, if a major storm should make landfall on the Texas Coast the effects may reach all the way to San Antonio. We can experience high winds and very heavy rainfall that may cause flash flooding. Also tropical systems once over land can spawn tornadoes inland. This occurred back in 1988 when Hurricane Gilbert made landfall on the coast, and several tornadoes touched down in and around San Antonio.

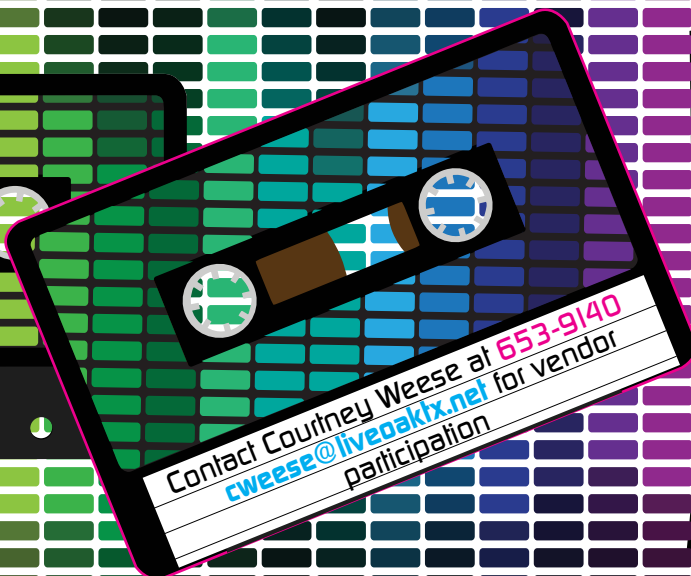

What We Do and How You Can Volunteer!



The Board of Adjustment is a board that provides a vehicle for citizens to appeal zoning interpretations and decisions of the Building Official, and request variances from the zoning ordinance. The Board may also make final decisions regarding changes, Variances, the reestablishment, or termination of nonconforming uses within the City. This Board is a decision board.

The Board meets the last Thursday of the month or as needed. All meetings are held at City Hall in the Council Chambers.

The Planning and Zoning Commission is responsible for recommending to the Council the creation and modification of zoning districts, as well as reviewing and approving all land plats submitted for filing with Bexar County. They also cooperate with Development Services and Economic Development regarding needs in city development. Duties of the Commission include hearing Zoning cases, Specific Use Permits and Plat approvals and citizens are encouraged to attend and voice their views on the cases. The Commission is a decision making board.

The meetings are typically scheduled for the last Thursday of each month at 6:30 p.m. All meetings are held at City Hall in the Council Chambers.

The Economic Development Corporation will facilitate growth and development of existing companies, as well as, provide the foundation to effectively recruit new companies to the area by developing and implementing initiative programs. The result of these broad and diverse economic development initiatives will be an increased property and sales tax base for the City of Live Oak, a dynamic economic environment for our business community, and an enhanced quality of life for Live Oak's residents. The EDC Board is a decision making board.

The meetings are typically scheduled for the last Tuesday of each month at 6:00 p.m. All meetings are held at City Hall in the Council Chambers.

The Ethics Review Board was created in 2006 with the passing of the City's Ethics Ordinance. The intent of the ordinance is to establish standards of conduct, which promote confidence in the government of this city whose actions ultimately affect the public faith in city government. The Board has the jurisdiction to investigate and make findings and recommendations on any alleged violation. This Board is a decision making board.

The meetings are typically scheduled as needed at 6:30 p.m., with one Annual Ethics Review Board Meeting held in December of each year. All meetings are held at City Hall in the Council Chambers.

The Parks and Recreation Commission assist city staff with the planning of parks and recreation programs, and to carry out the tasks that have been assigned to them during these planned events. The Parks and Recreation Commission assists in all city planned events, such as manning event booths, decorating for events, and assisting in clean-up. This commission is an advisory board only.

The meetings are typically scheduled for the first Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. All meetings are held at City Hall in the Council Chambers.

Reminder STOP The POP



The Live Oak Fire Department would like to remind everyone that Live Oak has an Ordinance in effect that makes fireworks illegal to discharge or even have in your possession within the City limits. The City will continue to enforce compliance with state law and local city ordinance, in respect to fireworks and fire and safety regulations this July 4th. If a minor is caught with fireworks, the parent or guardian will receive the fine even if they were unaware of the minor's possession and/or usage.

Citizens should report all complaints, regarding the illegal use of fireworks, directly to the LOPD Tel-communicator (non-emergency line) at 210-653-0033. If the citizen believes that there may be a fire and/or medical emergency related to the use of fireworks, he/she should dial 9-1-1 and request the LOFD.



The State of Texas is reporting that currently 12 Texas counties have cases of Zika virus including Bexar County. Because of the recent rains, you must protect yourself by eliminating standing water around your homes. Adult mosquitoes lay eggs in stagnate or slow moving water, potted plant saucers and in open trash bins. By eliminating these water sources, you can keep Live Oak's mosquito population down.



When working or playing outdoors, you may use insect repellents or wear protective clothing. If you want to use a more natural method, plants such as citronella, basil, catnip and lavender can be planted as a deterrent. You can also mosquito proof your homes by keeping screens on windows and doors closed. So if you are anti-mosquito, these tips can help you enjoy season-long protection from the dangers of mosquitoes.



Daytime is most dangerous

Mosquitoes that spread chikungunya, dengue, and Zika are aggressive daytime biters. They can also bite at night.



Use insect repellent It works!

Look for the following active ingredients:
• DEET • PICARIDIN • IR3535



Wear protective clothes

Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants and use insect repellent. For extra protection, treat clothing with permethrin.



Mosquito-proof your home

Use screens on windows and doors. Use air conditioning when available. Keep mosquitoes from laying eggs in and near standing water.

WATER RESTRICTIONS (Year Round and Stage 1)

Year-Round Watering: Watering with an irrigation system or sprinkler is allowed any day of the week before 11:00 AM and after 7:00 PM.

Stage 1 Restrictions: Last Digit of Address: 0 or 1 = Mondays | 2 or 3 = Tuesdays
4 or 5 = Wednesdays | 6 or 7 = Thursdays and 8 or 9 = Fridays
(No watering on weekends.)

Stage 1 Restrictions begin when the aquifer level drops to 660 feet mean sea level at the monitored well.

- All residential fountains and indoor commercial fountains can operate at any stage of drought. Outdoor; commercial fountains must have a Live Oak variance in order to operate during drought stages 1 through 4.
- Water waste is prohibited at all times. Water waste includes allowing water to run off into a gutter, ditch, or drain; or failing to repair a controllable leak.

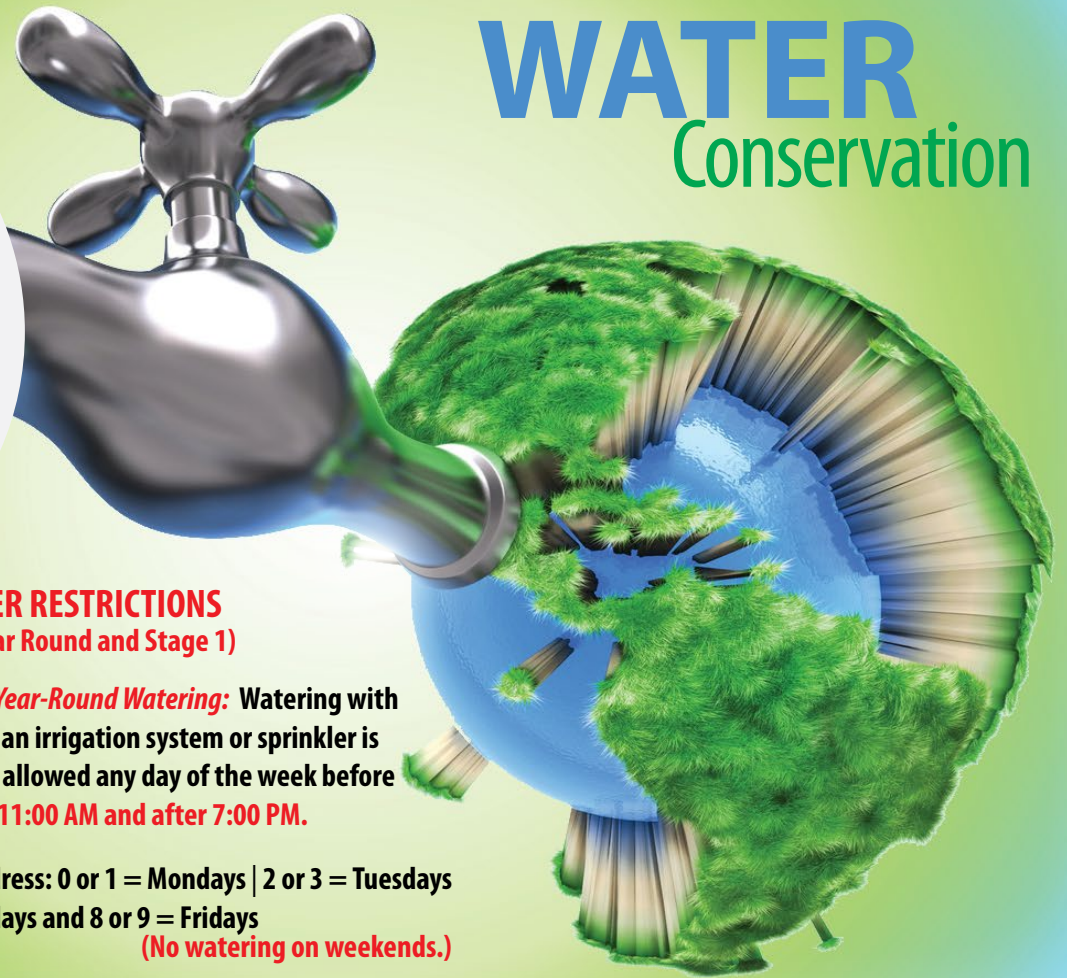

- Watering days begin and end at midnight; overnight watering is not allowed.
- You should reduce water consumption by any means available.
- All non-public swimming pools must have a minimum of 25 percent of the surface area covered with evaporation screens when not in use. Inflatable pool toys or floating decorations may be used.



- Hand watering with a hand-held hose, soaker hose, drip irrigation, bucket or watering can is permitted any time and any day.
- Washing impervious cover such as parking lots, driveways, streets or sidewalks is prohibited. Health and safety exceptions to this rule may be requested from the City of Live Oak in writing.
- Residential car washing allowed during drought once per week on Saturday or Sunday as long as there is no water waste.
- The use of commercial car wash facilities is allowed any day.



Household Hazardous Waste DISPOSAL

Do you have old paint, pesticides, herbicides, batteries or fluorescent light bulbs; electronic waste such as computers, monitors and laptops, that need to be disposed of? Live Oak residents please call **1-800-HHW-PKUP (1-800-449-7587)**.

Reduce Storm Water Pollution

Everyone can help to reduce pollution levels in our creeks and streams. Here is a tip that you can use for Lawn Care. Excess fertilizers and pesticides applied to lawns and gardens wash off and pollute streams. In addition, yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute nutrients and organic matter to streams.



- Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. When use is necessary, use these chemicals in the recommended amounts. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible.
- Compost or mulch yard waste. Don't leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drains.
