Dear Residents,

Throughout our city's history, volunteers have donated countless hours to improve the quality of life in our community. The success of any community is built upon the actions of individuals committed to serving their community with the desire to make it a better place to live, work and play. I would like to introduce to you one of our citizens that best fits this description, Joyce Smith. Ms. Smith demonstrates such exemplary service to the community and to the San Antonio area. Ms. Smith has made Live Oak her home for eleven years and owned her own business as a medical transcriber for our local physicians until she retired in 2010. In April 2001, she began participating in the "New Beginnings" program with New Hope United Methodist Church, when a friend contacted her asking for assistance. She would be helping a young lady and her daughter that had been recently in a protective shelter. Upon her leaving the shelter, the young lady had been given pieces of donated furniture but had no means of transporting the furniture to her new apartment and Ms. Smith would be making the delivery of the donated furniture. While visiting the shelter, Ms. Smith learned many of the women leaving the shelter needed assistance obtaining furniture such as beds, sofas, tables and chairs to begin their new lives.

Ms. Smith began canvassing the neighborhoods during bulk pick up and would find many of the furniture items. The furniture found during her searches would sometimes require minor repairs so she began to refurbish the pieces that needed a little TLC. She spent countless hours with her talent and compassion to those in need by staining, rebuilding, picking up and delivering the finished pieces to the families. In April 2013, she left New Hope, but continued her ministry calling it "His Helping Hand Ministry." In January 2015, the ministry was picked up as an outreach program by Grace Community. Ms. Smith has been able to help 975 families over the years and Live Oak is fortunate to have her as a hardworking citizen and volunteer in our neighborhood. For pets with proof of their annual rabies vaccination, the fee is \$5.00 for non-sterilized dogs and cats. Licenses for spayed or neutered dogs and cats are only \$2.00. So Your Trash Won't Fly

Plumbing Permits & Inspections

On many occasions, I have citizens asking questions about the requirements on obtaining a plumbing permit and whether or not the plumbing inspections are required. The answer can be found in the following code: The 2015 International Plumbing Code it states the following:

Section 104

104.2 Applications and permits.

The code official shall receive applications, review construction documents and issue permits for the installation and alteration of plumbing systems, inspect the premises for which such permits have been issued, and enforce compliance with the provisions of this code.

104.3 Inspections

The code official shall make all the required inspections, or shall accept reports of inspection by approved agencies or individuals. Reports of such inspections shall be in writing and be certified by a responsible officer of such approved agency or by the responsible individual. The code official is authorized to engage such expert opinion as deemed necessary to report on unusual technical issues that arise, subject to the approval of the appointing authority.

The other question I get is: **Does a plumber need to do the work?**

Under Section 1301.051 and Section 365.2(1) of the Texas State Plumbing License Law of 1947, a person who is not a plumber can pull the permit for a property if it is NOT a place of business or rental property, but a homestead wherein I reside.

Litter is a serious and costly environmental matter. Improperly contained household garbage is one of the main sources of litter in our community. Windblown litter also reduces the aesthetic appeals of our neighborhoods, parks and public places. We believe by bagging and containing your household garbage properly will prevent windblown litter from being an issue within the city. Our city ordinance dictates that household trash should be in an enclosed container OR sealed bags so as to prevent vermin and wind from spreading loose trash into yards, drainages and streets. Some things such as mother-nature are beyond our control, but taking precautions will prevent a messy community.

Below are excerpts from the Property Maintenance Ordinance 1483 approved on August 13, 2013:

Garbage Container shall mean any object that holds refuse and is leak proof, covered or sealed and includes tightly closed garbage bags, etc.

Outside Storage/Rubbish - The accumulation of discarded articles on private property which are defined as a "Nuisance" by the city ordinance is prohibited. An example of these items would be lumber, trash, rubbish, debris, abandoned, discarded or unused objects or equipment such as automobiles, tires, lawn mowers, furniture, stoves, refrigerators, freezers, appliances, cans or containers, etc. This ordinance is most commonly violated when residents store these types of items along the sides of their homes in plain view of the public. Violation of this ordinance is a major factor in the appearance of the city.

Please remember to **"Bag & Tie"...**so your trash won't fly! Help us keep Live Oak one of the best communities by eliminating unsightly litter in our neighborhoods. Should you have any questions or concerns about this article or any other Code Compliance issues, please call 653-9140, ext. 386.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIVE OAK, TEXAS, DECLARING THE UNOPPOSED CANDIDATES FOR THE OFFICES OF MAYOR AND TWO (2) CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS AS ELECTED; PROVIDING THAT THE MAY 7, 2016 REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION SHALL NOT BE HELD; PROVIDING A VOTING PLACE; PROVIDING A SUFFICIENCY CLAUSE; FINDING AND DETERMINING THAT THE MEETING AT WHICH THE ORDINANCE WAS PASSED WAS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AS REQUIRED BY LAW; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Live Oak, Texas, Chapter 205 of the Texas Election Code, Chapter 205.001, hereby ordains, enacts, passes, approves, and orders to be held on May 7, 2016, for the purpose of holding a Municipal Election for the offices of Mayor and City Council Members; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2.053 of the Texas Election Code, the Authority to file applications for a place on the ballot and the names of nominees is subject to the filing of a petition of nomination; and

WHEREAS, the City Secretary, in accordance with Section 2.052 of the Texas Election Code, has certified in writing to the City Council that the City Secretary has received no petitions for nomination for the offices of Mayor and Robert "Bob" Tullgren and Ed Cimics, and all nominees for these offices are of legal voting age; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the candidates whose names are on the ballot and whose names are on the ballot are not declared to be candidates and that no person is eligible to appear on the ballot for said election; and

WHEREAS, under the circumstances, Sections C, Chapter 2, Title 1 of the Texas Election Code, which are amended by Ordinance No. 1528, shall have been effectively amended by the City Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIVE OAK, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That, the date and content of the ordinance of this ordinance are hereby found to be true and correct.

SECTION 2. That, all ordinances which amend Sections 2.052 and 2.053 of the Texas Election Code, which are amended by Ordinance No. 1528, shall be null and void and of no effect and shall be deemed to have been effectively amended by the City Council.

SECTION 3. That, pursuant to Section 2.053 of the Texas Election Code, the regular municipal election for Mayor and two City Council Members called and ordered by Ordinance No. 1527, for May 7, 2016, shall not be held and is hereby cancelled.

SECTION 4. That, pursuant to Section 2.053 of the Texas Election Code, the City Secretary is hereby directed to cause a copy of the Election Cancellation Notice to be posted on Election Day, the same being May 7, 2016, at all polling places that would have been used in such election.

SECTION 5. Validity. That, all ordinances of the City of Live Oak in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby superseded and all other provisions of the ordinances of the City of Live Oak not in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. Severability. That, should any paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected.

SECTION 7. That, it is hereby found and determined that the meeting at which this ordinance was passed was open to the public, as required by Section 551.001 et seq. of the Texas Government Code, and that advance public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given.

SECTION 8. Effective Date. That, this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage, approval, and publication as provided by law, and it is accordingly so ordained.

Fireworks have a long history dating back to 7th century China. Eventually, the use of fireworks spread to other cultures and societies. The first celebration in America was Independence Day in 1777, six years before Americans knew whether the new nation would even survive the war. A lot of people like to celebrate U.S. independence with fireworks. But for the residents of the City of Live Oak, this sort of explosive patriotism is against the law.

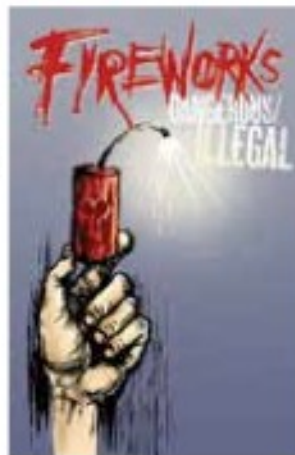
FIREWORKS

Are they "legal" & "safe" to use?

The City of Live Oak has an Ordinance in effect that makes fireworks illegal to discharge or even have in

your possession within the City limits. The City will continue to enforce compliance with state law and local city ordinance, in respects to fireworks and fire and safety regulations.

If a minor is caught with fireworks, the parent or guardian will receive the fine even if they were unaware of the minor's possession and/or usage. Citizens should report all complaints, regarding the illegal use



of fireworks, directly to the **LOPD** Tel-communicator (non-emergency line) at **210.653.0033**. If the citizen believes that there may be a fire and/or medical emergency related to the use of fireworks, he/she should dial **9-1-1** and request the **LOFD**. Fireworks are not only illegal in the City of Live Oak and certain parts of Bexar County, but they are also very dangerous. Fireworks and celebrations go together, especially during the holiday seasons and Fireworks can be very dangerous when used improperly. Improper use can cause serious burns and eye injuries.

- 230 people on average go to the emergency room every day with firework-related injuries in the month around the July 4th holiday.
- Of the fireworks-related injuries sustained, 74% were to males and 26% were to females.
- 9 people died due to 8 fireworks-related incidents. In at least 2 incidents, the victims WERE NOT THE USERS.

Follow these safety tips when using fireworks in areas where they are legal to use:

- Make sure fireworks are legal in your area before buying or discharging them.
- Never allow young children to play with or ignite fireworks.

Avoid buying fireworks that are packaged in brown paper. This is often a sign that the fireworks were made for professional displays and they could pose a danger to consumers.

Remember to follow the rules of Landscape-Water Conservation (Ordinance 1255) when watering your lawn and plants. When watering with a sprinkler, be careful not to water the sidewalk or the street.

The City of Live Oak follows San Antonio Water Systems' (SAWS) water restriction rules and their critical periods of water reduction. Year-Round watering restrictions may be declared when the Edwards Aquifer level is above 660 feet mean sea level at the monitored well. Landscape

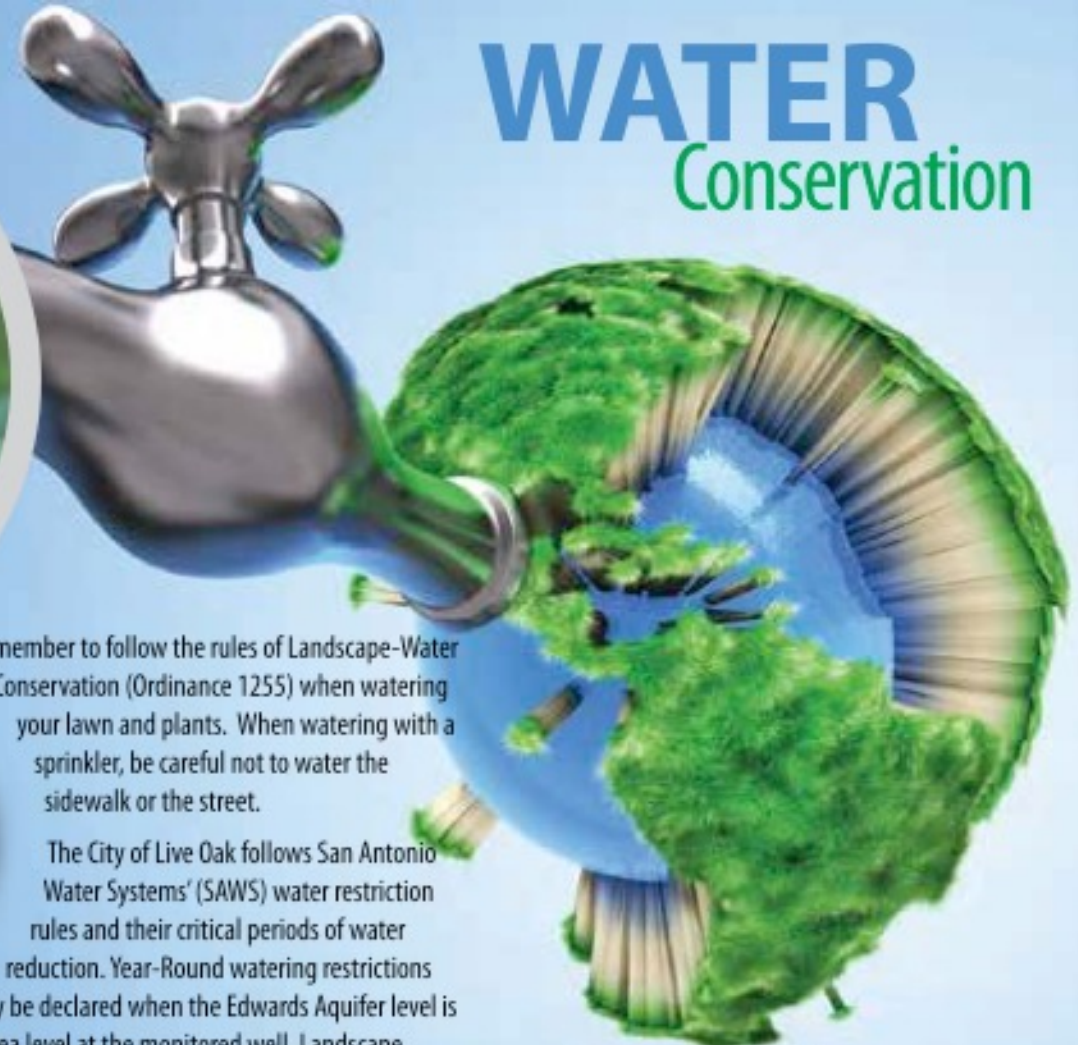
watering with an irrigation system, sprinkler or soaker hose in Stage 1 is permitted only once a week before 11 a.m. or after 7 p.m. on your designated watering day. Watering with a hand-held

hose, drip irrigation, bucket or watering can is permitted any time on any day. Water restrictions (on your designated watering day by the last digit of address) include watering times before 11 a.m. or after 7 p.m. in Stage 1 and 7-11 a.m. or 7-11 p.m. in Stages 2 and 3. Stage restrictions begin when the 10-day rolling average of the Edwards Aquifer level drops to mean sea level at the monitored well as follows: Stage 1, 660' (water once a week); Stage 2, 650' (water once a week) and Stage 3, 640' (water every other week). Visit our website to see the current restriction stage observed by Live Oak.

CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY

The program helps local residents better understand police work and strengthens the relationship between the community and police department. The classes are instructed by civilian and sworn members of the Live Oak Police Department. Some of the subjects covered in the classes are, city governance, police emergency communications, Texas crime information center, crime prevention, criminal investigation, patrol tactics, traffic stops, response to resistance or aggression, SWAT, drug enforcement, and firearms. The academy is approximately twelve weeks long and is held in the Alfredo F. Araiza Training Room located at the Live Oak Police Department. It is held on a week night and starts at 7 P.M. and ends at 9 P.M.

It is with a degree of sadness that the enclosed article on our telephone alerting system will be my last as the City's Emergency Manager as I will be retiring at the end of June. It has been my pleasure to work with numerous Mayors over the years that fill the position of emergency management director. In addition, I have enjoyed working with the entire city staff for almost 30 years and watching the City grow from a bedroom community to the bustling City we are today. It has changed a great deal from the time I first arrived in Live Oak as a member of the U.S. Air Force, stationed at Randolph AFB in 1977. I will continue to reside in the City and hope to stay involved in the community.



ALERT SYSTEM **Connect CTY Telephone**

In the event of an emergency, the Connect CTY Telephone Alerting System will be the primary means of notifying our citizens. The Live Oak Communications Center (dispatch) has direct access and can prepare and send a message within minutes. As such, we encourage all citizens to keep their telephone numbers up-to-date in the system. This includes your land line if you still have one, along with your cellular numbers for telephone calls and text messages. You may also include an e-mail address if you desire. In addition to emergency messages, the City may use the system to pass along important information like street closures or water outages. On occasion we may send out a call

regarding City events in the park or remind citizens about our upcoming elections. As a reminder, there are NO individual costs for this service and the data base is secure.

While many citizens appreciate the City's efforts to keep them informed, others may not. As such, ALL citizens have the option and capability to remove their numbers from the data base. In order to update your telephone numbers or to remove those from the Connect CTY data base simply go to the City Web Site. Under "City Services" select the Connect CTY item and follow the instructions. A word of caution however! As noted earlier, this telephone system is our primary means of communicating with our citizens in an emergency. One last item! If you are planning to move out of our City and you will be keeping your same phone numbers you will continue to receive calls unless you delete your name and numbers. If you change numbers the system will drop your land line number in the data base. 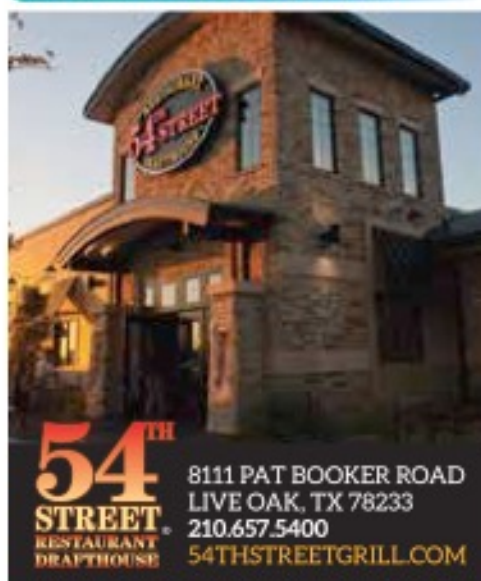
