Dear Residents,

As the holidays near, I would like to send out a heartfelt thank you to the citizens of Live Oak, our thoughtful businesses, dedicated city staff and emergency responders for their hurricane relief efforts after hurricane Harvey in August. As the first major storm to hit the U.S. coast in over ten years, many cities were devastated along our coastal line reaching as far as Louisiana. Our thoughts and prayers are with the families still displaced or in-between temporary homes during the holidays.

Relief efforts began immediately for the hardest hit areas including the Rockport, Houston, and Beaumont. Live Oak immediately offered assistance to the affected areas by deploying several of our Public Works employees to the City of Portland with 340 stop signs and poles after high winds and flooding demolished most of their street signs. Emergency responders worked in Conroe and Port Arthur providing relief so that their own firefighters could be with their families and begin the cleanup process on their properties.

As a personal friend, I reached out to Houston's Mayor Sylvester Turner offering any assistance that Live Oak could provide during the recovery efforts. During our conversation, his positive outlook inspired me when he said that "Houston would be open for business." I had no doubt with the leadership of Mayor Turner and the Texas can-do spirit, Houston would soon rebuild their communities stronger than ever before. We witnessed first-hand the resilience of Houstonians while attending my last TML conference as the acting President in October.

As a small community, we were able to provide donation drop off locations at our municipal complex, private citizens opened their homes to collect non-perishable items, and our Civic Clubs collected donations for the animals. Thanks to Genghis Grill, Express Nails & Waxing, Groomingdale's, LO Humane Society, Springs Apartments, Starbucks, Home Depot, and Whataburger for their generosity to fellow Texans. There are numerous businesses not mentioned that donated to the relief efforts and are still accepting supplies and monetary donations to this day. We thank all of them! As all levels of government, organizations, businesses and citizens responded heroically to the call to help others, it again highlights the importance of protecting the right of cities to serve communities in the way we were elected to do so.

In closing, I would like to thank you for your support during the year as Mayor and as TML President. I hope I've made you proud with the work we were able to complete on behalf of all Texas cities. Officer Araiza is the only Live Oak officer to die in the line of duty.

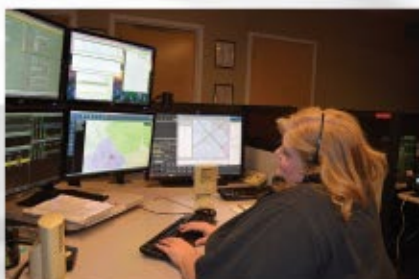
Ready for Duty

Most officers begin their day with a brief glimpse of their children and spouses as they kiss them goodbye or goodnight, depending on what shift he or she is assigned. As they leave the safety of their homes dressed in a police uniform their whole demeanor changes. They begin to prepare mentally for the uncertainty of the day ahead as they make the drive to the Police Department. No matter what uncertainties or stressful events they will endure, these officers stand “ready for duty” to protect Live Oak.



Silent Heroes, The Hero's Guardian

Officers communicate with public safety telecommunicators via police radios, CAD Instant Messenger, email and mobile phone transmissions. Our Communications Center has 10 full time public safety tele-communicators including an on-site Dispatch Supervisor and a Communications Manager overseeing all operations and related equipment. Our dispatch services extend to Live Oak, Selma and Judson ISD Police Departments, and emergency services for Selma and Live Oak Fire Departments as well as Schertz EMS. Most of their time on duty is spent handling call volumes at levels that would be utterly overwhelming to most. They are outstanding multi-taskers dealing with many different types of situations during a typical shift from receiving a 9-1-1 call about a home invasion to relaying vital information during a late night police pursuit. The valuable information sent out to the residents during a crisis or an emergency outage through our CTY system is also generated by the same telecommunicators sometimes in the middle of a police or fire emergency. It's very clear how important police officers are in helping to keep people safe, but there



are unsung heroes in law enforcement working behind the scenes who are just as important. The Hero's Guardians! Our 9-1-1 Telecommunicators are Live Oak's silent heroes and we honor them every April during “National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week.” They are the ones we depend on and want to hear every time we dial those three numbers, “9-1-1, where is your emergency?” We celebrate them for their dedication and their grace under pressure when people are most in need.



Blue Line Then and Now

The Live Oak Police Department was formed in August of 1961 with only a Marshal and one deputy. Jerry Smith served as the first to wear the Live Oak badge as "Town Marshal" and then as Chief of Police. Fast forward fifty-six years, the city now has a state of the art facility located at 8022 Shin Oak Drive. The new facility is home to the Municipal Court and Police Administration with 32 full time commissioned police officers and 2 Reserve police officers. The police

officers now have schedules based off of an 8 hour shift with a total of three shift rotations. Each officer will spend most of their shift working nonemergency calls including patrolling throughout the community, traffic patrol, writing reports or assisting other agencies.

Veteran Warriors Wearing the Badge

Today just 6% of the population has served in the military, but 19% of police officers are veterans, according to an analysis of U.S. Census data. Live Oak is proud to have eleven military veterans currently working for the department which include those that are retired and still serving in the National Guard units. Most of our police officers say the transition from serving in the military to serving the public as a civilian law enforcement was a natural fit for them and their families. The training during their military and police academy provided traits such as discipline, integrity, sense of service, commitment, and the experience of dealing with difficult situations. Live Oak officers demonstrate daily that they have the heart and compassion but more importantly, they all invest in caring about our community because most of them live and raise their families in Live Oak or in a neighboring town.



Leaving No Man

On average, Live Oak police officers receive 40 hours of continued education annually and typically average over 100 hours every two years in addition to the mandated training. Training topics include "Use of Deadly Force", weapons training with all types of firearms, baton, OC spray and Taser, First Aid and Emergency Driving. Physical training is a crucial part of any modern police officer's day due to the physical demands

required to perform reality based self-defense. These self-defense systems and tactics are designed to be simple but capable of being used against larger and stronger assailants. All of which provides an arsenal of techniques to prevent injury while protecting themselves or fellow officers from harm.

Community Policing & Mentoring Our Youth

Community policing is, in essence, a collaboration between the police and the community that come together to solve community issues. To achieve this combined effort, throughout the year, our police officers participate in local school programs and make regular visits to classrooms at both elementary schools located in the city. As the officers become active in building positive relationships with our youth by exercising a positive image, we have found it begins the process of breaking down the negative barriers of mistrust that is so often portrayed on the evening news. Some of Live Oak's successful community programs held yearly include the Blue Santa Program, greeting the public at "Coffee with Cops", teaching the Citizens Police Academy, Jr. Cadet Academy and hosting group tours through the station.





Top Dogs

In May 2017, the department retired its 5th police K9, "Bolo." After giving four years of service, Bolo developed arthritis in his back which led to the decision for an early retirement and allow him to take life a little easier.

Bolo was instrumental in the war on drugs in Live Oak and the surrounding region by assisting officers as a narcotic detection dog. During his tenure, he was responsible for eradicating \$122,240.00 of marijuana, \$888,678.40 of cocaine, \$1,720,022.40 of methamphetamines, \$13,607.40 of heroin, and \$1,011.00 of MDMA and \$751,210.00 of seized cash. These busts combined have a street value of \$2.7 million.



Bolo



Warrant

The search for a replacement began prior to Bolo making one last patrol with handler, Officer David Wall. The long tedious selection process of finding the perfect new canine would begin. Once the prospect K9 was chosen, specialized training began for both the officer and the new dog. The K9 was given the suitable name of "Warrant." Much like any specialty trained police dog, learning to respond to one handler is crucial for the duo to be a successful crime fighting team. Since then, the duo have clearly made a natural bond and have learned to look to each other for protection. Warrant is not only a police service dog to our department and our community, but he is already a valuable part of the Wall family when off duty.



Recognition with Honor


Most Police Officers will say it's the most rewarding job they've ever had. The dedication, integrity, courage and experience within our department speak volumes. Police personnel have an accumulative 428 years of service to the City between them and our citizens are very fortunate to have that amount of law enforcement experience in one small department. The experience and dedication paid off on March 16, 2015 when LOPD was honored with the "Recognized Law Enforcement Agency" title from the Texas Police Chiefs Association Law Enforcement Recognition Program. At that time, Live Oak Police Department became the 106th agency in the state to be recognized with this honor. In addition to the recognition that we pay our police officers and tele-communicators, the administrative civilian staff also play a significant role in the everyday activities of the police department and deserve just as much recognition. Most of the civilian personnel or non-sworn positions will occupy clerical positions or property technician positions but together with the uniformed officers, contribute to the well-oiled machine and daily business of a police department. Live Oak's civilian administrative staff are responsible for reporting state regulated crime reports, crime statistic reports, maintaining and retention of agency records and preserving and analyzing evidence required for pending criminal trials. Even with the increase in paperless technologies, agencies still need assistance with data entry to record information generated from the action of a uniformed officer.

Saluting Our Heroes

We may call them "heroes" at times, and they may call themselves "brothers and sisters in blue" but let's not forget that they are also known as someone's Dad, Mom, husband, wife, brother or sister. When they remove the uniform at the end of their day, they slowly transform back to the roles of parents, neighbors, military veterans, little league coaches and proud American citizens. Local Business Owner United With GI Father

The story of Don “John” Trinh and his lifetime journey to find his American father has been 49 years in the making. But before we tell you about his journey, let me introduce you to John Trinh and his wife Kathy. The Trinh’s have successfully owned and operated Kathy’s Nail Salon located at 8090 Pat Booker Road, for the past 17 years. Their nail salon is one of Live Oak’s small but popular, and profitable businesses. In fact, the “Best of Live Oak” award for “best nail salon” has been awarded to the salon multiple years in a row. As a successful businessman and proud American, we are honored to share John’s story in the “Veterans Day” edition of the Hometown magazine.



John’s story began in Vietnam in 1967 when his Vietnamese mother, Cay Trinh, met a handsome American serviceman and had a six month world wide love affair during his tour at Tan Son Nhut Air Force Base in Saigon, Vietnam.

By 1968, the USAF Staff Sergeant’s tour ended and he would return to America and be reassigned to Ent Air Force Base in Colorado Springs for the remaining six months of his four year enlistment. After his departure, Cay would discovered she was pregnant with his child. Fearing he would reject her and his unborn child, Cay kept the news from him. After being discharged from the Air Force, the soldier began a career in radio broadcasting for CBS and two of its stations in Philadelphia until his retirement in 2005. During that time, he married and began a family of his own, which would end in divorce. He would later marry a widow, and the love of his life Delores, or “Dec.”

During the decade-long war, tens of thousands of American servicemen fathered over 50,000 children with Vietnamese women. Very few of the fathers ever met their children, and fewer brought the mothers and

the children home to the states. Cay feared her unborn child’s fate would not be any different. On June 10, 1968 she gave birth to a healthy baby boy and name him Don. They remained in Saigon, Vietnam until 1985. Because he was “Amerasian,” Don “John” was constantly abused by other Vietnamese youths and beaten daily while walking home from school. “I was forced to eat horrible things during these incidents”, John recalls looking up to the heavens while crying out “Dad why aren’t you here to help me, make them stop?” That was when John decided to quit school; at the age of nine he begin killing squirrels with a sling shot to sell the meat to buy rice to feed his family. John never lost hope of better life and longed for the chance to find his father. He would keep this hope in his heart for years and become a stronger and compassionate human being despite his adversities.



When John was 17, his mother had remarried and had two more children, but the marriage would eventually would divorce. With the help of the American government, Cay was able to obtain a loan through a “work relief” program and a sponsor, to make the journey to America, settling in San Antonio.

John would find work to help his mother with the family's finances and legally change his name from Don to John after his father. At the age of 25, John knew he didn't want to be a statistic or a forgotten legacy and so he began the search for his American father. During this time John would marry Kathy and start a family of his own in Texas. After the birth of their son, Kathy said John's desire to find his father became almost an obsession. He began obtaining as much information as possible about his father from his mother. Armed with only the name "John Brown", his long 23 year search began in earnest; however, he would learn that the name John Brown was incorrect, but that incorrect name would prove to be a key in finding his real dad. After searching for years on the internet, John expanded his search by submitting his DNA sample to Ancestry.com. His DNA sample did not find a match for his father but, it successfully located John's second and third cousins who were part of his biological father's extended family and would also discovered he was part-Irish.

John knew the urgency of finding his father was greater than ever because his father would now be in his early 70's. He also faced the possibility that his father might no longer be alive or more importantly, may not be willing to reconnect with him, his wife Kathy and their son. But the determination to learn about his American roots had only grown stronger over time.

After countless hours searching and endless emails connections made along the way, there was finally light at the end of the tunnel. In December of 2015, to John's amazement, he received an email from John Reilly. Ancestry.com had contacted John "Jack" and Dee Reilly, notifying them that someone wanted to contact them. It turned out the surname "Brown" was John Reilly's grandfather. Reilly told John about the street where he and his mother Cay lived for six months in Saigon. John asked his mom to verify the street name, she did, and she also remembered the exact street number. John "Jack" Reilly then emailed John and began the note with the words..."Your search is finally over. I am your Dad!"

In January 2016 John and Kathy would travel to Hilton Head, South Carolina for a four day visit with Jack and his wife Dee. During that visit, John

told his dad and Dee about his walks home from school and the daily beatings and the violence he would endure. Jack, John, Kathy and Dee broke into tears and embraced. In June, Jack and Dee hosted a four hour luncheon in their hometown in New Jersey to introduce John and Kathy to eighty of their relatives and friends. In the fall Jack and Dee came to San Antonio Texas to visit John and his family and enjoyed the city's beauty, sights and restaurants.

Jack and Dee say it has been a true gift from God since they've been found by John. They are proud of what John and Kathy have achieved and now have two lovely new grandchildren. Today, John says "his heart is full" and could have never imagined he could feel as content and happy as he is today with his extended family.

His constant smile tells it all and the sorrow and pain has been washed away by joyous tears. Jack and Dee plan to visit San Antonio in May 2018 to watch John and Kathy's daughter graduate from high school. They look forward to creating many new chapters

in this new life together from this day forward. During my telephone interview with Mr. Reilly, I thanked him for his service to our country and for allowing us to share their intimate story in this special edition.





Considering Solar Panels?

Many Live Oak residents have already chosen or contemplating the idea of installing solar power panels on their homes. Solar power is an efficient, renewable energy source and is certainly a viable choice to make these days. The City does require a permit to be pulled prior to the installation of solar panels. We require the solar panel installers to be a licensed contractor with the city of Live Oak. Included in the solar panel/electrical permit, we require the contractor to provide proof of insurance, a HOA (Home Owners Association) letter of approval if applicable and a CPS (City Public Service) official stamped drawing to indicate it is a valid and approved installation. We urge our residents and business owners to insist on the contractor providing proof of the permit pulled with the city of Live Oak and not just the contract agreement with CPS. Having a permit for solar installation is mandatory and will give the resident or business owner the assurance that proper inspections will be completed for the work done on their home/business. We want to provide our residents and business owners the best possible service when work is contracted for their homes and establishments. One way we are able to accomplish

good service is through our permitting process. When any type of permit is pulled through our city, that permit must be closed out with a passed inspection from the city inspector. As homeowners, we all appreciate the assurance that the work we contracted to have done, is done properly. Please be careful to always ask for proof of a valid Live Oak permit and a valid Live Oak Contractor's license before any type of work begins on

Second Chance for "Rogue"



Hi, I'd like to tell you the story about how I was given a second chance to a new life filled with the love and care I desperately needed. On a hot August day, my journey to finding a new home began. During my travels, I would find myself in Live Oak near the Enchanted Oaks and Shin Oak area where I met two kind Animal Control Officers willing to provide me with fresh water and a cool place to rest. Once I received the rest I needed, I quickly realized that I didn't have to bark nor be afraid. I could tell they were trying to find my owner and get me back home and they began calling me "Darla." Many days had passed and sadly my owner still had not found me, but I remained calm and enjoyed the daily interaction that AC Officers Derrick, Cathy and Terry provided. My stay at the Live Oak Animal Care Facility also gave me a chance to meet several new kennel mates also waiting for their owner or possibly a new home. On August 22, it was my turn to visit the vet. The vet visit allowed me to take in the sights of the city and to meet the fantastic staff working at the veterinarian clinic. When my check-up was finished, I panted and kissed everyone goodbye. Later on, the Animal Control staff would receive my test results and we would learn that I was heartworm positive. The race to find me a home and receive

home so I didn't either. Terry reached out to the Animal Defense League in hopes they would have a spot available for me so that I could receive my first treatment. On September 8th, my dream of a second chance and the journey of searching for a loving fur-ever home were over. Two wonderful women came into the facility looking to adopt a lovable animal just like me! The adoption soon became official, I now have new owners! I now go by the name of "Rogue" and I will be spending cold days indoors in a warm bed, summer days



swimming in the cool rivers of Texas with my new brothers and sister Odie, Endy and Little and living right here in the beautiful city of Live Oak.

Second Chance for "Wednesday"

Blue and red heelers, or Australian Cattle Dogs by their proper name, are fixtures in Texas. They are working dogs as well as loyal family companions. Sometimes they go unwanted in shelters around the state. That's where Texas Cattle Dog Rescue (TCDR) steps in. TCDR is a non-profit, 501(c) (3) animal welfare organization dedicated to rescuing Australian Cattle Dogs from city and county shelters throughout Texas. They provide the dogs with the vet care they need and place them in foster homes where they will heal, learn and thrive—all in preparation for their forever homes. TCDR has rescued and placed about 120 dogs per year since it began in 2009. Sometimes rescues happen right here in our own back yard. Michelle Frey, a COLO

employee, who also happens to be a Texas Cattle Dog Rescue volunteer, noticed "Wednesday" as a pup that was ready for adoption on Live Oak's Facebook page. Michelle visited our Animal Care Facility to make an assessment of the dog's temperament and before we knew it, Texas Cattle Dog Rescue made "Wednesday" its 110th save for the year. "Wednesday" was adopted on Sunday, October 8th and now enjoys her fur-ever home and family. As she left our facility with her new family, she gave ACO Derrick a kiss goodbye.
